	[Tax havens that offer secrecy facilities and citizenship for sale undermine the integrity of tax administration and prosecution in many countries. These facilities have allowed fugitive economic offenders (FEOs) to evade prosecution by domestic courts. Many countries have taken concrete actions to stem the detrimental impacts of such jurisdictions. What kind of concerted actions can developing country authorities undertake to deny entry and safe havens to all FEOs, freeze the proceeds of crime and obtain asset repatriation along with the offenders? Can the UN Conventions on Corruption and Transnational Organized Crime as well as FATF regulations be used as tools in this effort and if yes how? What other steps can developing countries take to address the issue of FEOs?]
